**GENERAL DAYLILY INFORMATION**

**Tetraploid:** Contains 44 chromosomes. This means bigger pollen grains for the hybridizer! In general the tetraploid will have a heavier substance in flowers and foliage and thicker scapes. They can also have more vigor and larger more numerous flowers and brighter color.

**Diploid:** Contains 22 chromosomes. They have two identical sets of eleven chromosomes in each cell. One set comes from the egg cell, and one from the sperm cell in the pollen.

**Scape:** A flower stalk without leaves. This is the entire flower stalk above the crown.

**Dormant:** A plant that stops all vegetative growth and loses its leaves for winter regardless of the climate it is growing in.

**Semi-Evergreen:** Intermediate foliage is not dormant and not evergreen. Sometimes it is semi-dormant depending on the winter.

**Evergreen:** Foliage that remains green throughout the year unless frozen severely.

**Night Blooming/Nocturnal:** Flowers that open late in the day and remains open through the night and sometimes even through the following day. These are also considered the best for semi-shady locations (they won't lean towards the light). Nocturnal daylilies can oftentimes be fragrant.

**Extended Bloomer:** Flowers that remain open for 16 hours or more.

**Miniature:** Flowers that are less than 3" in diameter. They can have dwarf, medium or tall scapes.
